The college includes projects, industrial visits, and a curriculum on subject areas like consumer protection, Human Rights, Pollution control, climate change, sustainable development, soil conservation, etc.

Three years degree course leading to B.A., B.Com, B.Sc spreads over six semester in three academic calendar years. A student appears two semester in one calendar year. Teachers from affiliated college evaluate the answer scripts of semester examination.
